### "International Order of the Rainbow for Girls Founder"



Born in 1877. At 12 he joined the church, and at 14 began his ministry. At 17 he was ordained a minister Br. W. Mark Sexson was raised in Bloomfield Lodge No. 80. in Indiana in 1902. He became a craft lecturer and contributor of fraternal literature, spent practically all of his life in this field of research.

In 1909, he went to Assyria, Palestine, and Egypt in search of Masonic information.

Br. Sexson, was asked to speak before South McAlester Chapter No. 149, OES. As the Order of DeMolay had grown, he decided an organization for girls, setting forth some of the principles of Freemasonry, would be welcomed if it did not have a Masonic parent or grandparent requirement, as Job's Daughters did.

The International Order of the Rainbow for Girls was founded in 1922, the first class of 171 girls that was initiated on April 6, 1922, in the McAlester Scottish Rite Temple.

Today, IORG has a membership of 275,000 girls worldwide with over one million majority members. It is 45 states and nine foreign countries.

Why Is It Called Rainbow? In Genesis, after the flood, God made a covenant that He would never again destroy the earth and placed a Rainbow in the heavens as a symbol of that covenant. Br. and Rev. Sexson believed that this symbol of God's love was an appropriate symbol, so the Rainbow and its colors provided the inspiration for the name and lessons that are taught.
